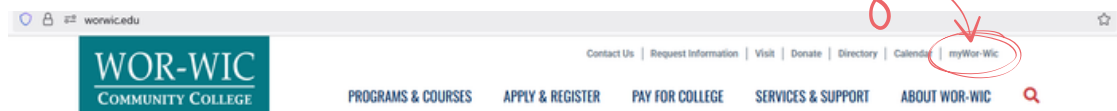

This was sent to the personal email address you provided. If you need help with this, please contact dualenrollment@worwic.edu.

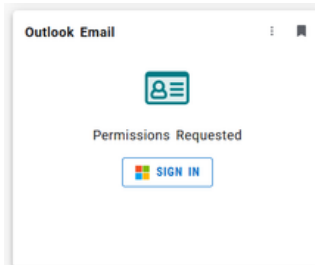
Log into your Blackboard account in your student portal.

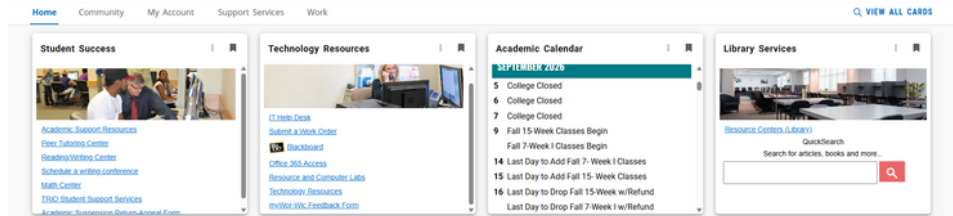

You are a Wor-Wic college student! Take advantage of all that we have to offer through the college; don't rely on your high school for assistance or information.

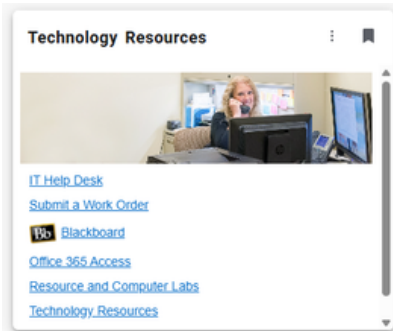
Familiarize yourself with the cards in your student portal and all that is available to you!

Read your course syllabus carefully!

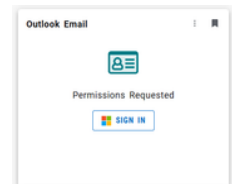
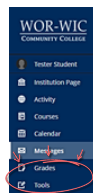
Every course, and every instructor are different. Do not assume policies from one course translate to another!

Know your instructor's **office hours**.

This time is specifically set aside for students to seek help, ask questions, and get tutoring. Take advantage of the time!

Check your WWCC email and Blackboard messages daily.

Instructors each have their own preferred way to communicate - it is your responsibility to stay on top of messages in both platforms!



Attendance is Mandatory!

- DE classes on campus at WWCC do *not* follow the high school's inclement weather delays/closings. Register for our Omniaalert system through your student portal for campus alerts.
- WWCC does not follow the high school sports schedules - travel for games/practices will NOT be considered an excused absence. *This applies to other extra-curricular activities as well.
- If you are sick, you are responsible for contacting your instructor to ask about missed work. Documentation for health, judicial, military, or religious exceptions may be required by your instructor! Be sure to ask.

Important to Know :

As a college student, you have privacy rights under FERPA—even if you are still in high school and under the age of 18. Your grades, coursework, and other educational information belong to you, so college staff must communicate directly with you about your academic experience. Parents and guardians cannot access this information or discuss it with college staff unless you give written permission for the college to share it with them.
