

Emergency Medical Services Program

Graduation Requirements

In addition to the general college requirements, the specific requirements for emergency medical services graduation are:

- 1. Satisfactory completion of all courses in the emergency medical services curriculum as outlined in the college catalog
- 2. A final course grade of C or better in all EMS courses
- 3. Complete the "Application for Graduation" form and submit the form with applicable fees to the Registrar's office prior to the start of the final semester before anticipated graduation
- 4. Earn a 75% on the medication math quiz conducted during EMS 208
- 5. Have satisfactory affective domain evaluations
- 6. Successfully pass the online paramedic examinations (through the FISDAP assessment tool) during the EMS 255 course held during the spring II semester (spring session E). Paramedics must achieve a cut score of 75%. Students have three attempts to pass the examination. The examination is conducted during the last week of classes for the EMS 255 course
- 7. Obtain a score of 100% in all skills, patient age groups, complaints and pathologies, and Team Leads as dictated in the patient contact and skills manual and FISDAP. Additional clinical time may be necessary to fulfill this requirement. All clinical competencies must be completed within 30 days of the conclusion of the semester, or the student will fail the course.
