

Articulation Agreement

Mount Aloysius College

And

Wor-Wic Community College

Mount Aloysius College (MAC) and Wor-Wic Community College (WWCC) agree that students earning the Practical Nursing Certificate and Associate of Science degree in Nursing, LPN to RN Pathway from Wor-Wic Community College may transfer to Mount Aloysius College with the following understandings:

1. This Agreement applies to students majoring in Bachelor of Science – Nursing at MAC. The program can be completed online.
2. The intent of this Agreement is to facilitate bachelor degree attainment for students in the Associate of Nursing, Associate of Nursing, LPN to RN Pathway programs at WWCC. Student must be a licensed Registered Nurse (RN) to apply for this program of study at MAC.
3. All courses numbered 100-level or above used to complete the Associate of Science degree with a grade of C or better are eligible for transfer to MAC and may be applied as lower division credits toward the minimum 120 credits required to earn a baccalaureate degree. A minimum of 60 eligible credit hours coursework is required in order to grant the student junior standing at MAC for the purposes of registration only.
4. The courses will transfer as identified in the Credit Transfer Guide.
5. As appropriate, courses transferred may fulfill lower division degree, general education, elective, and/or major requirements. See appropriate Advising Guide for requirements that are current as of the 2020/2021 Academic Catalog. It is best for the student to work with an academic adviser to determine which catalog rules apply.
6. Students may have lower-division requirements to fulfill in addition to the degree continued from WWCC and will be responsible for completing all graduation requirements for MAC in effect at the time of graduation from MAC in order to earn a baccalaureate degree.
7. Students must meet MAC admission requirements in place at the time they apply for admission to MAC.

8. Students will be responsible for find their own practicum site for following modality clinical courses:
 - NUBS 440P – Leadership Practicum

9. This Agreement will be in effect beginning Fall 2021 or upon date of last signature, whichever is later. Curriculum changes by either MAC or WWCC must be communicated in writing no later than June 30th of the year of implementation. This agreement will be reviewed every three (3) years to ensure the continued appropriateness and viability of this Agreement.

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Students matriculating from this articulation will be waived from LJBA 150 – College Success and the Mercy Experience (2 credits).

Students at Wor-Wic Community College may take additional core courses there and transfer them into the program at Mount Aloysius. Mount Aloysius allows the transfer of up to 90 credits into a bachelor's degree program. The transferability of the additional credits can be confirmed with the Registrar's Office at Mount Aloysius College.

Most nursing professionals complete this program of study online at a part-time status. Students completing an online degree completion program at Mount Aloysius pay the lower Graduate and Continuing Education tuition per credit rate for up to 11 credits per semester. Once a student schedules 12 or more credits in a term they are billed a flat tuition rate for full-time tuition. The above plan is primarily a full-time rate of pursuit. A student's academic advisor at Mount Aloysius will help part-time students develop an appropriate degree plan for the program.
