This course is designed for MPCTC-certified instructors who seek to become proficient in LEEMCC skills and demonstrate the ability to teach course objectives effectively. Upon successful completion of the course, participants will be qualified to teach LEEMCC courses under supervision, with the opportunity to achieve certification as a lead LEEMCC instructor. Additionally, students will receive a provisional teaching certification upon successful completion of the course. Full instructor certification will be granted after completing two teaching segments under the supervision of a certified Trainthe-Trainer LEEMCC instructor.

Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate proficiency in LEEMCC skills as outlined in the LEEMCC Skills Guide, including care under fire, wound management, and patient assessment.
- 2. Meet the cognitive and psychomotor objectives of a student who has completed the LEEMCC course.
- 3. Achieve a minimum score of 80% on the LEEMCC final examination.
- 4. Maintain the psychomotor and cognitive knowledge required to teach LEEMCC course material effectively to students.
- 5. Recognize and adhere to LEEMCC course policies.
- 6. Relate curriculum materials to course objectives during classroom instruction.
- 7. Employ established curriculum standards to develop lesson plans for LEEMCC courses.
- 8. Facilitate student skills practice during LEEMCC training.
- 9. Effectively utilize PowerPoint presentations and other support materials during instruction.

- 10. Evaluate student comprehension of course material through established assessment methods.
- 11. Identify sources for obtaining LEEMCC support materials.
- 12. Demonstrate proficiency in teaching and explaining objectives outlined in the LEEMCC Skills Guide.

This course is designed to meet requirements as mandated by the Maryland Police Training Commission and to meet the annual in-service requirements.
